



Position Announcement

Fisheries Analyst for FishSource at the Sustainable Fisheries Partnership (SFP)

Position Description: Conduct analyses of stock assessments, management, and ecological impacts of wild fisheries around the world with focus on Spanish-speaking countries. Analyses will be published on SFP's global database of fishery status and environmental performance, <u>FishSource</u>. The information compiled for this position is then used by seafood companies and major buyers to influence improvements in fisheries where needed.

Position Qualifications:

Requirements

- At a minimum Bachelor of Science in a fisheries, marine, or ocean field
- Knowledge of fisheries stock assessments, management plans, and ecological impacts of fishing
- Excellent communication and organization skills
- Ability to interact effectively with a variety of staff from various cultures and countries
- Ability to comfortably read, write, and speak in Spanish and English
- Ability to maintain information in strict confidentiality
- Ability to work from a home office
- Ability to travel internationally once or twice per year

Highly desirable qualities

- Knowledge of fisheries and fisheries management systems in Spain and/or South and Central America
- Scheduling flexibility to accommodate a virtual organization with staff working from home offices around the globe, as well as ability to work productively primarily via Skype/Google Hangout, email, webinars, and other electronic means
- Connections with a university, government, company, and/or non-profit organization involved in fisheries
- Good judgment

Special skills and strengths

- Ability to synthesize and condense highly technical information into concise and easy-tounderstand language
- Ability to establish and maintain open communication, culture, and cohesiveness in a virtual organization.





Level of Effort: Full time (40 hours per week)

Position Relationships: Reports to the Director of FishSource, which is a program within the Systems Division

Job Responsibilities:

Research

- Gathering information for fisheries analyses is a 'desktop' exercise. The successful candidate will rely primarily on internet searches to collect information.
- However, often times (particularly in smaller-scale fisheries and countries with poor transparency) information is difficult to obtain through internet searches. The successful candidate will establish relationships with fisheries researchers, scientists, and managers at universities, non-profits, and government agencies to collect necessary information.

Data Analysis

- The successful candidate will adopt and use the standards and methodology in the FishSource Author's Guide to conduct analyses
- Analyses require good judgment. The successful candidate will have to make fair and unbiased decisions based on the information available.

Other possible duties

- Implement quality assurance processes and quality control checks
- Review content and analyses conducted by contributors to FishSource who are external to SFP
- Provide technical support and training within SFP and to external stakeholders
- Track and report fishery improvement project (FIP) progress on FishSource
- SFP is a dynamic, opportunistic, and practical organization. Occasionally, the SFP staff will ask the successful candidate to perform other duties that they are interested in.
 - For example, FishSource team members assist in the development of global seafood sector reports and in conducting special analyses for SFP's leadership or corporate partners.
